
Welcome to Aleph Bet Hebrew School.

Curriculum

The Aleph Bet Hebrew School offers a warm and lively Jewish atmosphere where children can attain a unique and exciting awareness of their Jewish identity.



The Aleph Champ Reading Program

Beginning with letter recognition for our youngest children, this program leads them through phonetic decoding, reading, comprehension and writing. Age appropriate workbooks, games, and flashcard exercises will be completed throughout the year.

The Aleph Champ Program is developed after the karate motivational system of levels and colored belts. The entire Kriah (Hebrew Reading) system is divided into levels of different colors. This arrangement ensures that students learn to read Hebrew in an efficient, wellorganized method.

In the Aleph Champion Program, reading groups are divided by color instead of age group, thereby allowing conscientious students to advance in reading on their own.



This program ensures that students do not go on to a new level until they have truly mastered all that their current level expects them to know. This avoids the common problem of children learning to read without fully mastering a letter, vowel or concept in



reading.

Jewish Values and Ethics

Using textbooks and class discussion, the students will read and analyze stories and case scenarios that have practical application to our daily life. They will understand that our

religion is based on G-d given set of values and morals, to teach us how to lead our lives, in a positive way.



Holidays

Hands-on lessons on each Jewish holiday will fill the calendar, as we proceed from Rosh Hashanah through to the holiday of Shavuot. The students will gain a deeper understanding of each holiday, traditions and customs. Aleph Bet Hebrew School will also host holiday cele-

brations for our students and their families.

Torah (Bible) and Jewish History

The children are introduced to the characters and stories of the Torah. According to each grade the students will work through an overview of Jewish history starting with our Patriarchs and Matriarchs to the giving of the Torah to modernday Israel.



The Meaning behind Mitzvot

Why do women light Shabbat candles? What makes food "Kosher?" Why do we have a Mezuzah on our doors? At Aleph Bet Hebrew School we teach basic Mitzvot to the younger grades, and provide insightful meaning of more complex Mitzvot to the older grades.
